The Hottest Weather Known. "What is the hottest weather ever known in the United States?" The question is answered in the statistical Weather Service. The highest temperature recorded by the United States Signal Service was at Phoenix and Fort McDowell, Ariz., in June, 1888. The thermometer marked 119 degrees. However, unofficial observers report temperatures as high as 128 and 122 degrees at Mammoth Tank and Humbolt, Cal. The coldest weather recorded by the service was 69 degrees below zero, at Poplar river, Mo. But this is a warm place compared with Werchajansk, Siberia, the coldest inhabited spot on the globe. The thermometer there has been as low as 90 degrees below zero. In view of these figures, let us not complain of a paltry 90 degrees above zero.

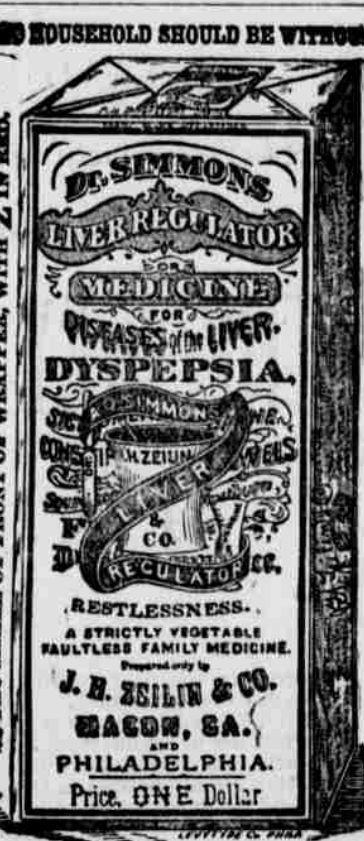

A FAMOUS BATTLE-GROUND.

On the banks of the Tippecanoe, a small stream which enters the Wabash River in Indiana, was fought the terrific battle of Tippecanoe.
