A Synopsis of the Markets-Boying and Selling Prices.

The markets in the grain circles have been rather of a dilapidated order for some time past. Wheat is still ruling at 6 cents, and with very poor prospects in view for better prices. When navigation on the river is good, it may have the effect of raising the present low price a cent or so. The nurket of the world seems to be well supplied, and it will be several months no doubt before any decent rates are offered.

The hop market is dull-very dull. Raisers are only realizing 8 cents per pound for their hops and of course much dissatisfaction is felt. The market to be anyways profitable in this line must pay from 12 to 15 cents per lb. There yet remains a large portion of this seacon's crop on hand.

The vegetable kingdom remains firm. Potatoes are selling at a good price and also such country produce as butter, eggs, cabbage, etc., etc. The meat market is rather on a standstill. Butcher shops sell at regular prices, but live stock is rather declining.
