The English tory organs are making the most of the recent scandal from Chicago about fixing the jury for the Cronin trial.

The bodies of thirty-six men entombed in the explosion at the Bentley colliery at Loughton, Eng., Wednesday, have been recovered.

Hervey, who accidentally shot himself in the abdomen on Tuesday morning at Baker City, Or., died yesterday from the effects of the wound.

The Capital Freehold Land and Investment Company of England has filed a charter with the secretary of state of Texas.

The coffin containing the remains of Ralph Waldo Emerson, whose grave was disturbed Saturday, has been placed in a securely bound box, which in turn has been deposited in a grave composed of blocks of granite, cemented together and securely fastened with a granite covering.
