At last eight men have been sworn in, and a jury was likely to be impaneled to hear the evidence given by the prosecution against the men being tried for the foul murder, when lo! another crime is discovered, and that is the tampering with or attempting to bribe these eight men by giving them from \$1000 to \$5000 apiece to vote from first to last for acquittal. The money to be used was the money which honest Irishmen had paid in to what was called the Burial association, or rather the proceeds of Ogden Grove picnics and the like, which the Irishmen generally supposed was used to aid Parrell in fighting English landlordism.

There has been a halt called, however, and one man is now under bonds of \$10,000 to answer to the charge of trying to bribe the jury-men on this great case. This man is John Graham, a lawyer's clerk, and the evidence against him was given by Fred Smith, who confessed to the facts under which he is indicted. Two or three others have turned state evidence, and it is likely to be a very black mess before it is well settled.
