## A TRAIN ROBBED.

Bold Deed of two Unmasked Men-Intimidate Rallroad Employes, KANSAS CITY, Nov. 26.-The north-bound passenger train on the Missouri, Kansas, and Texas road was "held up" to-night near Perry station, Ind. T. The express and mail cars were robbed. The passengers were not molested. The amount sucured by the robbers is unknown.

Kansas and Texas mail express. At Pryor creek two armed white men, unmasked, forced the engineer and fireman to descend from the cab. The station consists of not much more than a water-tank and a toolhouse, and there was no one to interfere with the robbers' work. The robbers proceeded to the mail car, where they intimidated the mail agents and rifled the pouches of their valuable contents. They next directed their attention to the express car. There also the agent was intimidated by threats and the safe emptied of treasures valued at several thousand dollars.

WINTER WASH.

Among the many washes used for air line of only eleven miles of land, larvae of insects, but the accumula-

> Take one pound of American or Babbitt's concentrated lye and dissolve in two and one-half gallons of water. This strength of wash should not be used after the buds have commenced to swell. If wanted for use after the foliage has started the strength should be reduced, by using twice the amount of water, making one pound of lye to five gallons of water. In using these lye washes the handa should be protected, otherwise disagreeable sores

may be the result. The Board would call upon every citizen loyal to the great fruit interests of Oregon to aid in every possible manner in the destruction of these enemies of the fruit and tree. which have secured so strong a hold in many of our orchards, and keep them from spreading into parts of our state not as yet infested by them. This spreading is done largely through the medium of the apple box, fruit trees, selons, etc., shipped in from parts now affected.
