SPOKANE FALLS, Wash., Dec. 13. The trial of Miss Ione Skeels, better known as "Bronco Liz," for murdering her husband, Charles W. Skeels, in this city on the 1st of March last, began in the Superior Court to-day. The murder was prompted by jealousy. Mrs. Skeels decoyed her husband from the room of Frankie Howard, a variety actress, by sending a boy with a message to the effect that he was wanted at his place of business. When he appeared in the hallway she fired three shots in rapid succession, one of

which took effect, proving fatal. Skeels first met his wife in a dance house at the Cœur d' Alene mines several years ago, but tired of her wife often told him she would kill thropy. him if he did not stop it.
