The Land Purchase Act Strongly Opposed.

REVIEW OF THE STATE OF IRELAND.

How the Cause of Home Rule Has Progressed Since 1875.

The Balfour scheme for a land purchase bill for Ireland is meeting with a strong opposition in the house of commons.

The bulk of the conservatives and unionists approve the measure. All the Parnellites condemn it as clearly in the interest of the landlords.

There is undoubtedly a great revolution pending in England. It is both of a political and social character, but that it is to be sweeping there can be little doubt to any student of history.
