

## POINTERS FOR THE REPUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION.

Uphold the republicans in congress in revising the tariff in the interest of the farmers as well as the manufacturers. The new tariff bill will favor the wool industry, by shutting out the competition of cheap foreign wool, and saving the home market for the American producer of wool. Sustain the party in that.

The present republican congress proposes to put a duty of 15 cents a pound on hides, of which we import at present \$20,000,000 worth per annum. Abolish free trade in hides and you benefit every American farmer without advancing the cost of boots and shoes at retail. Sustain the party in that.

Sustain the party in its effort to cut down the revenues of the government \$50,000,000, by reducing the tariff on sugar at least one-half, and as far as needed on all articles where it can be done without crippling any American industry.

The republican party is making a heroic fight for a free coinage silver bill, and Senator Mitchell is leading the fight in the senate. Sustain the party in that.

Sustain the party in its battle for equal rights for the disfranchised colored republicans of the South and their representatives entitled to seats in congress. That is a sacred American principle and let us stand by it.

Sustain Postmaster-General Wamaker in his earnest efforts to secure for the people a Postal Telegraph.

These are all steps in the right direction and the republican leaders are entitled to be upheld in their labors. The republicans of Marion county will do well to send delegates to the state convention who will uphold these popular measures of right in the interest of the people.

SALEM, April 7, 1890.  
E. C. Bump, resp. vs. J. S. Cooper, app. appeal from Benton county; judgment reversed and the cause remanded to the court below for a new trial. Opinion by Lord J. Chief Justice Thayer says "I am not in favor of sending this case back for a new trial, as I think that the judgment appealed from can be modified by this court, and the legal rights of the parties be preserved without a new trial; the question as to the hops being of an inferior quality has been considered and determined by one jury and we have no reason to disturb the decision of the circuit court upon that point, and the new trial will protract unnecessary litigation as I view it."
