First Result of the Pan-American Conference.

Representatives of nine of the American republics—namely, the United States, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Salvador, Honduras, Bolivia, Ecuador, Peru and Brazil—have signed a formal treaty of arbitration. It is expected that three more signatures and seals will be added very soon, and it is hoped that the signatures of all the American powers will be secured in the course of the summer and autumn.

Possibly James G. Blaine may never be president of the United States, but whether he is or not his name will go down to history as one of the greatest of American statesmen.

It is not easy to overestimate the importance which this step will assume in the eyes of Europe. The diplomats of that country are accustomed to look below the surface of things and to read between the lines of treaties and agreements, and when they see nine American republics, including the United States, solemnly agreeing to submit their national differences to arbitration instead of making war, it will not fail to occur to them that the next and most natural step would be for these same nations to band together for the common defense in case of attack upon any one by a European power.
