Gems of Thought From the Pen of Marie Bashkirtseff—Russia's Child Genius.

Few books published have attracted wider attention than "The Journal of Marie Bashkirtseff." The indorsement given by Gladstone had the effect of causing it to be widely read in England, on the continent of Europe and in America.

This diary was not at first written with an idea of publication, but the thought grew upon her. Her father was a Russian provincial nobleman, and her mother was from the same rank. The mother traced her ancestry through a wild Tartar tribe. Of her aspirations and ambitions she says:

"Whatever may happen to me I beseech my journal to be public."

"Up to the time I was 12 years old I was spoiled. All my wishes were granted, but my education was neglected. At 12 I asked for masters. They were given to me and I myself arranged the schedule of my studies. I loved everything to myself."

"When the fever of reading took possession of me I became wild, and it seemed to me that I should never read enough."

"I have a smattering of everything, but I know thoroughly only history, literature and physics."

"These notes will be read patiently only by some thinker, some great observer of human nature."

Her first love went out to a nobleman she knew only by sight, and who never knew of her existence. But she occasionally stooped to explain as:

"I often invent a hero, a romance, a drama, and I laugh and weep over my invention as if it were a reality."

She had several mild attachments of the heart, but only once does she relate that she was actually kissed, and the shame of it haunted her for months.

Her character is best summed up in her own words: "I detect the golden mean; I must have either a life full of excitement or absolute calm."

Her beauty was her hobby, and her whole nature culled out to be admired. Of the picture presented herewith she wrote:

"I was fifteen years old, and how pretty I was! My form, my hands, my feet, were not, perhaps, fully formed but my face was ravishing."

Proposals for Wood.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the secretary of state until May 20, 1890, for the delivery on the Capitol grounds, on or before August 1, 1890, of all or any part of 125 cords of fir and 100 cords of oak wood, corded closely.

Oak must be sound body, timber cut from thirty trees and not more than six months cut.

Fir must be cut from large live trees. All wood must be four feet long, reasonably straight, and not less than 2 1/2 inches in diameter.

Separate bids will be received at the same time and place for cutting into three cords, storing and stacking the same in the Capitol building; storage to be completed by September 1st, 1890.

Bids will be opened at above office at 2 p. m., May 20th, 1890.
