HUNG TO-DAY!

Pellio the Squaw Murderer Executed.

HISTORY OF THE AWFUL DEED.

Sandy Olds Still Unhung, But no Sympathy for an Indian.

LO, THE POOR INDIAN.

PORTLAND, June 6.—[Special report to the JOURNAL.] The statement that a white man with moneyed friends and a poor illiterate Indian occupy similar positions in the eyes of the law is perfectly farcical.

As a comparison picture,—one of gloomier hue, is that of Pellio, the Umatilla Indian, convicted on purely circumstantial evidence of murdering a squaw while he was drunk. He was sentenced to be executed to-day without an effort in his behalf.

THE TRIAL.

Circumstances undoubtedly do point toward Pellio as the murderer of the Indian woman, but no one saw the crime committed.

It seems strange that no one has ever taken an interest in this Indian's case, for there are always persons who are willing and anxious to assist a condemned murderer, especially when there is even a shadow of doubt as to his guilt.

Pellio, however, is alone. He will go into the jail yard and be dropped into eternity from a scaffold there. He will then be given a burial in the pauper's cemetery, and will then pass out of the minds of the people who will care but little whether his punishment was merited or not.

DETAILS OF THE HANGING.

"Pello," the Indian convicted of the murder of a half-breed woman on the Umatilla reservation, and sentenced Jan. 30th, was hanged here to-day by the Federal authorities, assisted by county officers.

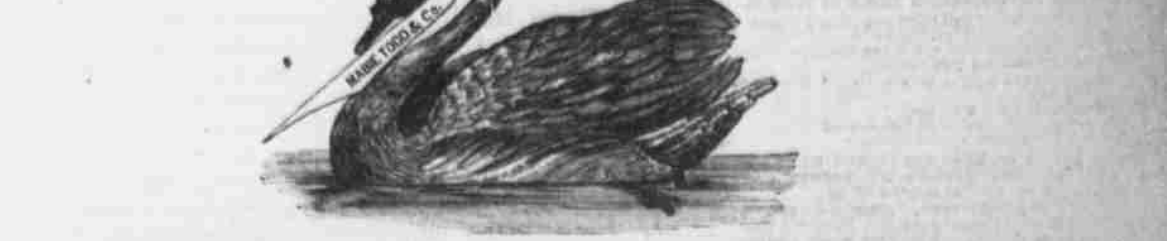
