PROPER USES OF SUNDAY.

Cardinal Gibbons Regards the Day as Sacred to Religion and Relaxation.

Since the meeting last Sunday, Rev. J. S. White received a copy of the Catholic News, published in New York, in which is found the following article from Cardinal Gibbons, the highest authority in that church in the United States.

"I think that Sunday should be, first of all, a day devoted to religious worship, and second to innocent and healthful recreation, as being the only day in which the great masses of the people have time to seek relaxation from their work.

"The Christian Sunday is not to be confounded with the Jewish or even with the Puritan Sabbath. It prescribes the golden mean between rigid sabbatarianism on one hand and lax indulgence on the other.
