SCHOOL DESK CONTRACT.—The board of school directors of this district met yesterday afternoon to consider the bids for supplying desks for the North Salem school. There were three bids presented, but that of the Minneapolis Office and School Furnishing company, represented by G. W. Chapman, of Portland, was accepted. The bid is for something over two hundred desks and seats combined, of the most approved pattern and solid make, at the following prices, screwed to the floors and ready for use in school here: Single desks, A and B sizes, \$3.90 each; C and D sizes, \$3.80; E and F \$3.65; rear seats, all sizes, \$3.65. They are of white ash, finely finished, built in good shape for convenience and comfort and the castings are very heavy and durable. The manufacturers sign a guarantee agreeing "to warrant all desks under this contract to remain firm and solid and in good working order for the period of ten years, and agree to replace any castings broken in shipment, or by fair usage in school room for ten years." The contract for four teachers' desks and four chairs was let to G. W. Frasier, agent for C. T. Weber & Co., of Portland, for \$98.

ATTACHMENT SUIT.—At the instance of the First National bank, this city, an attachment has been issued against the plant of the Dorance Lumbering and Manufacturing company, doing business at Hudson, Douglas county, which is now shut down and in the hands of the sheriff of that county. The company is composed almost entirely of Salem and Marion county men, who have invested largely in the enterprise, men whose individual business is in excellent financial shape and they feel very much chagrined at being involved in a legal controversy. This occurs, too, at a season when the mill should be doing its best work and is crowded with orders, hence the loss of time is damaging. The company has put in some \$30,000 in cash and one of its members informs a JOURNAL man that the property, including a large tract of fine timber, is worth between \$75,000 and \$100,000, so that the difficulty will be only temporary and all will be made right in a short time, the plant cleared from pressing incumbrances and the industry placed on its feet again more prosperous than ever.

TO BE RESURRECTED.—A joint stock company was formed yesterday and articles of incorporation filed, the object of which is to own and operate a flouring mill at Jefferson. The capital stock is \$25,000 and the incorporators Lewis Savage, R. L. Skinner and A. Grant. This will probably result in the reopening of the fine mill at Jefferson, which has been shut down the past few months on account of financial difficulties, and if so, it will be glad news for the people of that pleasant town. It is rumored that the warehouse there will be in charge of A. B. Hudson, an active and responsible citizen of Jefferson.

KNOCKED OUT BY KIDS.—There was an interesting game of ball in Wilson avenue last evening between the Statesman nine and the "Junior" nine, which is composed of small boys ranging in age from 12 to 16 years. The conquerors of the plumpers and real estate men were badly defeated last evening by the lads in a score of 14 to 10, in which the Statesman nine played seven innings and the kids six. The little fellows found it easy work to down their antagonists, and suggested to them that they were probably better printers than ball players.
