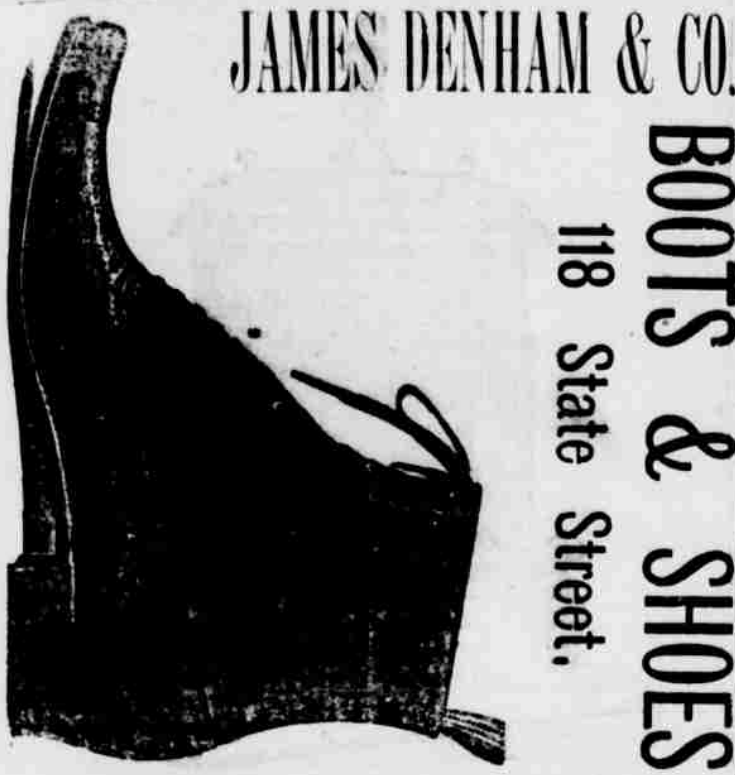

AS TO POLITICAL INDEPENDENCE. As the Stayton Sun and Woodburn Independent agree that the JOURNAL is not an independent paper (not of their own style, at least,) we are glad to let the matter rest right there.

A number of political counselors, these two among others, are giving advice to young men, to cut loose from the republican party and thus become freed from partisan slavery. The counselors in this case are all anti-republican independents, democrats or political agnostics.

If these worthy counselors are in a party that allows them no individual independence, better they get out and come into the republican party where men are free, as the birds of the air, to think and act for themselves, and where they will only have to find fault with themselves if the party is too progressive for them.
