CRIMINAL.

THE LOVER'S DEADLY CRIME. SACRAMENTO, Oct. 23.—On Sunday night, seven miles from Walnut Grove, Antonio Donata, an Italian, was stabbed in the abdomen by Cincha Donata, the young man receiving injuries which may prove fatal.

Away back in Italy, years ago, Cincha loved and courted a daughter of the elder Donata. The young people were greatly attached to each other, it is said, but the father objected to their marriage and the match was broken off.

In the meantime, the daughter of Antonio, despairing of ever again beholding Cincha, married another. Cincha was heartbroken when he heard this news, and when he learned that Antonio had received a long letter from his daughter, he determined to see it.

He went to the old man and asked for the privilege of reading the epistle from his sweetheart, but the father sternly refused. Pleasings and threats were of no avail and finally Cincha, in a rage, drew a knife and plunged it into the old man's abdomen.

These facts were communicated to the district attorney to-day and he at once ordered that a complaint be filed, charging Cincha Donata with assault to murder.

A COLONEL KURS AWAY WITH A WIFE AND \$5000.

SPOKANE FALLS, Oct. 23.—P. Korse, a resident of Portland, Or., was in Spokane yesterday looking for his faithless wife, who stole \$5000 from him and eloped with a man named Weber, colonel of United States troops at Vancouver.

Four years ago Korse returned one day to his home in Portland and found there a visitor, Col. Weber of the Vancouver government troops. Korse knew the colonel, for he had been a frequent visitor, but had been previously forbidden to enter the house.

Investigation showed that the officer was also Weber. The two came to Spokane and registered at the Eagle house as Mr. and Mrs. Van Reelie. Korse arrived here today on their track to find that they had been there for three hours. They have gone to Victoria.

MURDERED FOR MONEY. CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 23.—It has been learned to-day that Bresell, who was murdered at Desplaiques last night, had about \$6,000 in money and notes on his person, of which over \$1,000 was in cash.

This afternoon the police have arrested three men on suspicion of having murdered Bresell. They were found in the neighborhood where the crime was committed.

TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 23.—The British statesman, Goldwin Smith, in discussing the McKinley act, says Europe and Canada will wait for the result of the fall elections to congress, now almost at hand.

AN INSANE MAN'S CRIME. BERLIN, Ger., Oct. 23.—A retired farmer named Gast gave to his children some sweet meats in which he placed a quantity of poison. He then partook of the poison confection himself. The murderer and his three children have died in great agony. The other children are dying. Physicians say there is no possible chance of saving them. No reason is known for the crime.

REFUSES OFFICIAL RECOGNITION. VIENNA, Austria, Oct. 23.—It is reported that J. Black, the newly appointed consul of the United States at Peith, while journeying to that city to assume his duties, commented publicly upon Austrian affairs in a manner which offended the government, and that the government has withheld its exequatur.

ALBINA POSTMISTRESS.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 23.—The president has appointed Mary A. McKenzie postmaster at Albina, Oregon. The office has become a presidential one.

FATAL COLLISION NEAR PORTLAND THROUGH INATTENTION TO SIGNALS.

PORTLAND, Or., Oct. 23.—A collision occurred this morning between two freight trains on the Union Pacific railroad near Fairview, about 14 miles from this city. Engineer Jack O'Brien, of Albina, was killed and William Heinworth, fireman, had his right shoulder crushed. Three box cars and both engines are badly wrecked. The accident is attributed to inattention to signals.

NEW YORK, Oct. 23.—Blakely Creighton, a banker of 72 Broadway, was this morning found dead in his office, having shot himself during the night.

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 23.—Only meagre reports obtained concerning the reported riot in Coffee county, as the trouble occurred some distance from the nearest telegraph office. It appears that in the riot four white men were shot down.

ACCIDENTS.

TERRIFIC EXPLOSION IN A CARTRIDGE FACTORY IN CONNECTICUT.

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Oct. 23.—One of the ultimate departments of the Union Metallic Cartridge Co. was blown up with terrible force at 9 a. m. today, causing great consternation among the 600 employees in the main factory. Geo. Baker and son Fred W. were employed in the department at the time. A moment before the explosion the air became frightened and left the place. The father was blown to atoms, and the body scattered in every direction. The explosion shattered a large quantity of glass in the main building and on the opposite side of the street.
