

CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

Only one Councilman Absent and "Business" the Word.

SOME PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS ORDERED

Treasurer's Report—New Hose Cart—Alley Sewer Tax—Amending City Laws.

The council met in adjourned session at their chambers last evening with Mayor Williams presiding. There were present on roll call Councilmen Hirsch, Gray, Collins, Lafore, Strang, Brown and Hutton; Recorder Coun. Marshall Street, City Surveyor Gessner and Trust Commissioner Graham.

The minutes of last regular and called meetings were read and duly approved. The committee on ways and means, to whom was referred the ordinance bill for the amendment of chapters one and two of the city laws, recommended amendments in relation to the fees of city recorder and marshal. Report adopted.

The same committee reported in the matter of improvements petitioned for by the citizens of Albert's addition, that that part of the city a fast settling up with persons who generally own their own homes and that these people are entitled to a fair share of the expenditures for public improvements. They, therefore, recommended that fire hydrants be placed at the intersection of Oak and Capital streets and at the intersection of Twelfth and Leslie streets as soon as sufficient power is provided in the water mains to make the hydrants of service; to erect an electric light forthwith at the intersection of Oak and Capital streets; that a bridge be needed on Capital street as petitioned for and would be a great convenience to the petitioners and to the public generally, and that the street commissioner have estimates, plans and specifications made with a view to advertising for bids for the construction of the same. The committee reported that the matter of improvement of the streets was not within its province and recommended that it be referred to the committee on streets and public property.

The report was adopted serially to the last recommendation, which was on motion referred back to the committee on ways and means with power to act.

The committee on accounts and current expenses reported in favor of the payment of the following claims against the city, and on motion the report was adopted and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts:

The committee on streets and public property recommended that the prayer of the petition of Steves Bros. and others for a sewer through block 70 be not granted until the consent of property owners affected thereby is obtained. Report adopted.

Same committee recommended the granting of the prayer of the petition of H. J. Agers and others for a sidewalk along block 75, and the same was adopted.

The city treasurer's report for the quarter ending Sept. 30, was presented as follows and referred to committee on ways and means:

A petition was read from Capital Engine fire company asking for the purchase of a new hose cart to be drawn by a horse; also a proposition from P. J. Larsen & Co. to build a good and sufficient hose cart for a sum not to exceed \$250. The whole matter was referred to the committee on fire and water.

The city surveyor reported the following amounts due from property owners in blocks 86 and 87 on account of alley sewers through said blocks:

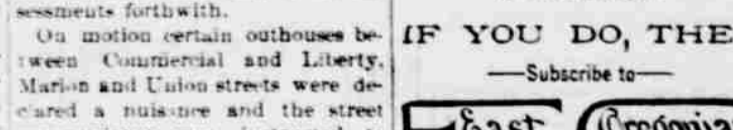
