ACCIDENTS.

TWO TRAINS COLLIDE. PORTLAND, Dec. 18.—Last night the Albany express on the Southern Pacific line, which leaves at about 5 o'clock, collided with the Portland and Vancouver train at the crossing at the intersection of J and First streets.

INDIAN HOSTILITIES—KILLING IN THE FIGHTING WARRIORS.

DENVER, Colo., Dec. 18. A special from the sixth cavalry in the Cheyenne river, via Rapid City, says: "Major Perry's command was joined early this morning, and Scout Gu Craven reported that near Smithville a large number of Indians were seen in a small creek in the brakes.

They and their escorts were attacked by forty Indians and over one hundred shots were exchanged. One soldier was wounded and another was shot through the hat.

TO STOP WORK ON THE UNION PACIFIC SOUND EXTENSION.

Yesterday Mr. V. C. Bogue, chief engineer of the Union Pacific, received a dispatch from New York, stating that the executive committee of the Union Pacific have directed that the work shall be suspended on the road from Portland to Seattle.

As a result of the new railroad movement, that the great roads, the Northern and the Union, will cease to antagonize each other is most probable. Co-operation, rather than continued opposition, may be expected—each road developing its own territory, and each granting accommodation to the business of the other.
