of the most productive and profitable crops for South Dakota, A farmer near Pierre raised twenty takes the matter in hand little acres of augar beets this year that stands in the way-not even tin yielded twenty tons to the acre, which are worth, when - manufactured into sugar, \$4 per ton, or \$80 per sere. These beets were raised without irrigation.

In 1850 the farmers owned threefourths of the aggregate wealth of the United States; in 1860, about one-half; in 1880, about one-third, and in 1890, barely one-fourth. The diminishing proportion means that a great many important industries have been developed in the country since 1850, and that, while the farmers own vastly more in 1800 than they did in 1850, other great interests have added enormously to the national aggregate of wealth.
