SECRETARY WINDOM'S SPEECH.

His Last Words Before Death Glean His Lips. Below we give the closing portion of the speech delivered by Secretary Windom at the Board of Commerce banquet in New York:

THE QUALITY OF CIRCULATION is even more important than the quantity.
