A FEW ARE HESITATING.—The subsidy for the electric road to the fair ground is still growing and is now about all raised. The right of way is also about settled, only one or two are yet hesitating to give way and these will doubtless give way freely when their own interests, as well as that of the public, are duly considered. There is no one but can see the great public advantage of this road. A small private inconvenience should not be allowed to stand in the way of a great public benefit. That is not the spirit which goes to make any city prosperous. This road to the fair ground is worth thousands of dollars to Salem and should be built, and immediately. Let the spirit of progress pervade this matter and all obstacles will disappear.

STILL IN PROGRESS.—The Aumsville riot case is still in the court. About thirty-five witnesses have been examined and few facts have been developed that were not brought out in the trials in lower courts. The only fact emphasized is, that it was made an unpleasantness to the quiet and peace-loving people of Aumsville, and will bring no good to those who are indulging in the neighborhood row. These people have rushed into court and are now paying heavily for their hasty actions. The large number of witnesses subpoenaed with eight or ten of the leading lawyers in the city will bring a large bill before the case is ended. The testimony is about all in and the case will be submitted to the jury tonight, whose verdict will be awaited with interest.

mission. Shall have to vote against the bill.
Tongue said he realized that there are two forces in the senate. Said the gentleman had introduced one or two bills at the beginning of the session, but had heard nothing from them since. There are two forces, one wants no legislation, and the other force have not fully outlined their position. The commission, if proper power was given it would afford relief to the people and prevent injustice to the railways. Had hoped for something better than that these gentlemen would assist in defeating the only measure now offered for the relief of the people.

Veach explained that he had introduced a maximum rate bill and had referred to the committee on railroads at the beginning of the session where it was still sleeping like a new born babe.
Tongue replied that his experience with new born babes was that they made more noise than the senator's bill.

Fulton explained that Iowa was working under a railway commission and had years ago done away with the maximum rate law. Said the measure is just and right. Allows the commission to fix their rates. What more can be done? It is right and reasonable that this commission should fix the charges. Nothing more reasonable ought to be asked by the people. The people demand this legislation and I don't wish any other kind of a measure. Will the senate shrink from its duty? Are you at the last hour, at the last opportunity, going to vote down the people's measure?

Fulton said the members of the house had passed this bill. They had come here direct from their constituents. The members of the house know better what the people want. I don't envy any man who shall return home after voting against this bill.
Raley said he would support the bill if he believed the people would find it in relief. I shall vote against this bill and for the repeal of the commission.

All the other senators voted against the bill except Blackman who was absent. The bill failed to pass, 13 to 15.
Tongue immediately renewed his motion to reconsider the vote where by S B No. 1, by Veach, repealing the railway commission law was lost. The vote carried 16 to 12 and the bill was placed upon its passage and passed by 16 to 12.

When the president announced the result the democratic members broke forth with loud applause and clapped their hands.

President Simon rapped loudly and incessantly with his gavel, said, "the senate will preserve order, it is nothing uncommon for the senate to pass a bill."

S B No. 20—Veach's maximum rate bill was ordered returned from the committee on railroads and made a special order for Wednesday at 2 p. m.

Meusdorffer's bill for incorporation of religious and benevolent institutions taken up and passed.
Said the bill to limit the hours of labor to eight hours a day taken up and passed.
Senate resolution, by Eakin, regarding the per diem of the officers of the senate, adopted with amendments. The chief clerk, first and second assistants, and reading clerk got \$10 per day, pages \$4, and mailing clerk \$6.
Adjourned.

House met at 9:30 a. m.

House Res No. 9—Ordered 30,000 copies Resources of Oregon printed for use at World's fair. Adopted.
Rep Minto moved reconsideration of vote by which house refused to concur in senate city hall commission amendments to No. 118, Portland police charter. Carried.
Rep McCracken moved to concur in city hall commission amendment.

Rep Hall moved to table. Ayes 21, nays 35.
The house then concurred, reversing its vote of yesterday.

THE SPECIAL ORDER
was on Raley's \$400,000 portage railway bill. The house committee reported in favor of the state operating a transfer boat, when congress shall have built a portage railway, and so an end bill.
The question being on the adoption of the house railway committee report on the Raley bill with amendments; ayes 40, nays 19.

Rep Miller moved suspension of rules to place bill on 3d reading. The house refused to adjourn.
And upon objection of Rep Butler that it was a bill to raise revenue and could not be originated in the senate, it was recommitted.
House adjourned.

AFTER DEFEATING Raley bill with house amendments, house took up and cleared calendar of all house bills.

H B No. 237—By Johnson amending Dailies city charter. Read 1st and 2d time by title. Referred to judiciary committee.

Senate concurred in H C R No. 9, H J R No. 24—Adopted.
President signed house bill 197.
THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILLS.
No. 174—By Watkins, appropriating \$3,000 for wagon road in Lane county; failed to pass.

The committee on assessment and taxation reported amendments to house bill No. 248, by McCoy, providing for the assessment and collection of taxes. The amendments make no material change in the workings of the bill, but if concurred in by the house will render it more effective. Street railway, telephones and electric lights are not required to pay upon their gross earnings but upon the actual value of the property. The exemption of \$300 is stricken out. Insurance companies will be required to pay taxes upon their gross earnings.
Before the amendments were read the senate adjourned.

ROLL CALL.

President signed senate bills 79, 207, and 216, and house bills 113, 29, 96, 102 and 142.

Senate bill No. 126—By Veach, fixing maximum rates of freight by railroads, was special order for 2 p. m. postponed until 4 p. m.

Fulton moved a reconsideration of H B No. 97 by Miller, defining duty of railway commission. The motion prevailed.

The motion whereby H B 97 was ordered to a third reading was reconsidered.
Tongue offered an amendment giving a sheriff a right to bring suit against a corporation in the courts also requiring the commission to enforce rates made by them by writ of injunction.

Fulton offered an amendment authorizing suit to be brought in the county wherein the injury occurred. Also authorizing summons to be served upon any agent or employee of the company in the county where the injury occurred. Also an emergency clause was added.

The amendments were adopted. Rules were suspended, the bill read a third time and passed.
