REPORTS OF THE STORM. SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 30 .- Yesterday's storm was unquestionably the heaviest of the season in the Northwest. It spread with equal force over pretty nearly the entire Pacific coast., at least from the extreme north, including Montana, and as far south as Tehnchapi and to some extent in Southern California. The center is located by the weather bareau as in Northern Washington. In San Francisco the velocity of the wind was but twenty-two miles an hour yesterday morning. What it was at The Heads the bureau could not report, because the Point Reyes wire is also down. At Sacramente the wind velocity was twenty-eight miles, at Red Bluff forty miles, at Carson thirty-two miles, at Winnemucea and Walla Walla forty-four, Eelena, thirty-four miles an hour. The rain fell in a monotonous drizzle all day, for fourteen hours preceding 7 o'clock in the morning the local fall was 1.16 inches, and for twelve hours succeeding, up to 8 o'clock in the evening, 1.06, making storm total in this city 2.22 inches a remarkably heavy fall.
