THE DEACON TRIAL. American Authors—Divorced and Remarried, Etc. DEACON UP FOR TRIAL. For Shooting M. Abielle, His Wife's Paramour.

Nice, May, 21.—The trial of Edward P. Deacon, the American, for killing his wife's paramour, M. Abielle, began yesterday morning. The courtroom was crowded by prominent people, including many ladies of fashion, attired in elegant costumes. The weather was warm, and as the crowd sat in the courtroom, the temperature became almost suffocating. This had no effect upon the eagerness of the ladies, who sat calmly fanning themselves throughout the session, paying the closest attention to everything said and done. The crowd in the gallery was composed almost entirely of members of the aristocracy of Nice. Hardly a dozen Americans or Englishmen were seen. Judge Aubertin, president of the court, was on the bench. Count du Molron, procurer of the republic, represented the prosecution. Deacon, was represented by Maitre Demange, a celebrated advocate of the Paris bar; M. Goiran, an equally well-known lawyer, of Paris; Frank Pillotte, of the Nice bar, and Solicitor Bret, of Cannes. The Abielle family, though not taking part in the proceedings, was represented by Maitre Lalroille. As Deacon was brought into the courtroom by the gendarmes, all eyes were turned upon him. Pallor marked his features. He neither looked to the right nor to the left, but concentrated all his attention upon the judicial bench. Deacon is 50 years of age, with thin hair, showing grey. That he was nervous was betrayed by the spasmodic contraction of eyelids and mouth. He was very firm, however, and with thorough ease responded through an interpreter to the questions asked him by the procurer. Mrs. Deacon, who had been formally cited to appear, was not present. On an invitation from the president of the court, Deacon detailed the facts of his married life, which, he said, was happy until his wife met Abielle. Then he proceeded to tell the story of the growing intimacy between them; his efforts to have her break with her lover; their frequent quarrels and reconciliations, and finally his discovery of her in her night dress in a room of the Hotel Splendide with Abielle, and the killing of the latter in what appeared to be in a flagrant delictu.

Divorced and Remarried. HALIFAX, N. S., May 21.—A romantic marriage was celebrated at Windsor Thursday night. Five years ago Dr. W. R. Buchanan married Miss Patterson, of Halifax, and removed to New York. Three years later he instituted proceedings for divorce, and she returned to live with her parents.
