A Sure Cure for a Balky Horse. An officer of the police detail said recently: "When I was a mounted policeman I learned of a most hunane and kind method of curing a balky horse. When the horse refuses to go take the front foot at the fetlock and bend the leg at the knee joint. Hold it thus for three minutes, and let it down and the horse will go.
