THE CITY COUNCIL.
The Street Improvements—Reports, Etc.
THE MOTOR COMPANY'S FRANCHISE.
Reports—Bills Allowed, Etc. Meeting Again Tonight.

The contract is finished and before the remainder of the price is paid. The matter of assessing the abutting property owners for street improvements now in progress was referred to the committee on streets and public property and the city attorney with power to act.

The committee on fire and water reported that 1000 feet of hose had been ordered and was now here.

The committee on fire and water was given further time to report on the pressure of the fire hydrants about the city.

The street commissioner was ordered to notify the Willamette Valley Flouring Mill Co., that unless work was begun to lower their dam in North Mill creek within ten days he would alter it at the company's expense.

The matter of opening 15th street was referred to the committee on streets and public property.

The recorder was ordered to pay amounts of the policies on insurance of the city's buildings.

A petition for electric lights in the band stand in Wilson avenue was referred to the committee on fire and water with power to act.

The two ordinances granting to the Capital City Railway Co. and the Salem Motor Railway Co. certain street railway privileges in the city were referred back to the committee on ordinances, which is to report an engrossed copy of the Salem Motor Railway Co., at an adjourned meeting tonight.

The city attorney was instructed to call on the county for the amount of road taxes due the city.

The matter of selling the people of Seio two old hydrants was referred to the committee on fire and water with power to act.

The Salem Truck and Dray Co. was allowed a bill of \$3.02.

A PREMIUM HOUSE.
Strong's Bakery and Restaurant—Immense Business.

The most conspicuous display in the 4th of July procession at Salem was without a doubt the float representing Strong's bakery, and the one for Westcott & Irwin's restaurant. One was a literal bakery, with mammoth oven and bakers at work with real dough, while the other represented a dining room running in full blast. The guests were devouring fried spring chicken, and all the delicacies of the season. No wonder these exhibits received the first prize offered by the committee.

The firm would also have had out a display from their wholesale house on State street except for lack of time. At this establishment on Commercial street one thousand guests were served on that day. They are prepared to double their capacity on such occasions, as they have an additional range and kitchen and need only to employ extra cooks and waiters. Ever since this firm has taken hold of the restaurant their business has grown, until today they have as heavy a run as any restaurant in the state, not excepting Freeman's, in Portland. Everything is bought at wholesale, their supply department representing the capacity of several stores. Flour is bought in car-load lots, and other things in proportion. The retail department of this business is of such proportions and growing so rapidly that enlarged quarters will soon be necessary. The question will no doubt arise as to the cause of this phenomenal success, and one need only turn to the energetic young men who conduct the business for his answer. They thoroughly understand every detail of their business, and are constantly on the alert for improvements which will add to the comfort of their patrons. Their ice-cream business has grown to such an extent that an ice house of 100 tons capacity has been put up, and by another year a large wholesale ice cream factory will be necessary. This branch of their business alone required six additional men on July 4th.

THE MOTOR COMPANY'S FRANCHISE.

The city council met in adjourned session last night.
The committee on ordinances, to whom was referred the ordinance granting to E. F. Parkhurst, E. N. Derby, H. W. Cottle and George Williams the right to build and maintain an electric line in the city, recommended that it be passed with a number of minor changes.

BILLS ORDERED PAID.
The following bills against the city were ordered paid: Robert McKillop, \$23; R. A. Kirk, \$6.50; Salem Gas Light Co., \$71.40; Capital Lumbering Co., \$222.28; F. J. Jacobson, \$2.35; Union Title Abstract Co., \$2; R. A. Crosson, \$6; H. H. Robinson, \$24; J. D. Woods, \$24; Gray Bros., \$30.40; Mike Horgan, \$8; Baker & Strang, \$357.64; W. Holcomb, \$2.75. The bill of the Salem Abstract Co., for \$50, which has been discussed in the council for an indefinite time, was allowed.

Gideon Stolz was granted permission to put in wagon scales in front of his place of business on State street.

The petition for repairs to the sidewalk on the south side of State street between Front and Water was granted.

The committee on ordinances reported recommending that the Capital City Railway Co. be given a franchise on Liberty street from Chemekeeta north to the northern boundary of the city limits; and across Mill creek to Bellevue on 13th to the southern boundary limits, was adopted.

STREET IMPROVEMENTS.
Street Commissioner W. J. Cullen made the following estimate for June on Goodhue & Co's work on Commercial street, in South Salem.
Excavation, 5400 cubic yards at 21cts, \$1134; curb, 1065 feet at 5cts, \$53.25; gutter, 1065 feet at 9cts, \$95.85; gravel, 4000 square yards at 11cts, \$44; total amount, \$1382.40; less 10 per cent, \$138.24; amount due, \$1244.16. Report adopted and bills ordered drawn for amount.

He also gave the following estimate on Archie Mason's work on Chemekeeta street for June.
Cutting, 7128.7 feet at 10cts, \$712.87; gutter, 7204.7 feet at 9cts, \$648.42; amount of both, \$1361.29; gravel on property, 22,364 square yards, at 18cts, \$4025.52; gravel on intersections, 8537 square yards, at 18cts, \$1536.66; amount of both, \$5562.18; less 30 per cent, for wetting and rolling, \$1668.65; leaves \$3893.53; amount of curb and gutters, as above \$1361.29; total amount, \$5254.82; less 10 per cent, \$525.48; amount due, \$4729.34.
