

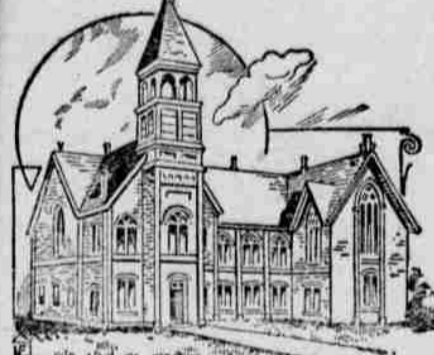

FRAUDS THROUGH THE MAILS.

Some of the Many Schemes That Are Constantly Being Worked. The frauds attempted by the use of the mails are almost innumerable. They consist of schemes concocted to humbug the unsuspecting public, and it seems the greater the fraud the greater the returns to the swindler. Nearly all of these schemes make use of advertisements published in newspapers and of circulars distributed through the mails. Without these means the public could not be reached, and for this reason the law has been enacted prohibiting the use of the mails for fraudulent purposes. But it is to be borne in mind that unless complaints are made to the postoffice department these frauds are carried on without any knowledge of their existence and no investigation can be had.
