on 2 acres of land. Saturday there were 28 teams waiting to unload grain at the Rickard flouring mills.

Anyone going around over the country on this year quite easily detect the light crops of grain, growing on the lowlands. As a rule they are very thin, low and poor looking.

The only variety of prunes which did well is the Petit. Wherever any trees can be found of this kind they are full of fruit.

Plums and peaches are a minus quantity. As far as the trees are concerned they did well by attaining a good growth of foliage.
