Democrats Have Hogg Again
In Texas.

MCKINLEY'S DISTRICT DEMOCRATIC.

Alliance May Hold Balance of
Power in U. S.
Senate.

NEVADA.

CARSON, Nev., Nov. 10.—The
Weaver electors carry the state by
an estimated majority of 1500.

WYOMING.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Nov. 10.—It
will require the official count to de-
cide if Wyoming is for Harrison or
Weaver. The majority will not be
100 either way. Chairmen Vandev-
eer, of the Republican state com-
mittee, has conceded the election of
Osborne for governor, and Clarke
for supreme judge.

INDIANA.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 10.—Returns
from all except 13 counties, at Demo-
cratic headquarters, show Demo-
crat's plurality 8,886. Counties not
yet reported, expected to swell this
to 10,500, possibly 11,000. People's
party vote expected to reach 25,000.
Prohibition 12,000. Democrats elect
10 members of congress. Republi-
cans 2, and 1 in doubt. Legislature
largely Democratic.

CLEAN SWEEP FOR WEAVER.

DENVER, Col., Nov. 10.—Returns
from 41 out of 55 counties, indicate
that Democratic Populist fusion ticket
carried everything from presi-
dential electors to constable. Re-
publicans concede everything except
Holm for governor. Weaver in re-
turns has a majority of 14,864. Leg-
islature probably Democratic, for the
first time in the history of the state.

MICHIGAN.

DETROIT, Nov. 10.—Complete re-
turns show the election of seven
Democratic, and 5 Republicans to
congress. Republicans elect 9 presi-
dential electors, Democrats 5.

ALLIANCE MAY HOLD BALANCE OF
POWER IN U. S. SENATE.

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—Indica-
tions point to the balance of power
in the United States senate being in
the hands of the Populists, or Farm-
ers' Alliance. The Democrats appear
to have gained control of the leg-
islature on joint ballot in four states,
which are now represented by Re-
publicans in the upper house, and
the Populists claim to be able to
elect three new senators. This will
change the standing of the different
parties in the senate from 47 Republi-
cans, 39 Democrats and 2 Farmers'
Alliance to 43 Democrats, 40 Republi-
cans and 4 Farmers' Alliance.

The terms of 29 members of the
senate will expire March 3, next.
Eighteen of these are Republicans
and 11 Democrats. Of the latter
there is some doubt as to the return
of three. Of the 18 Republicans
whose terms expire in March, 10 are
supposed to be reasonably sure of re-
election. The others are somewhat
questionable.

MCKINLEY'S DISTRICT LOST.

ALLIANCE, Ohio, Nov. 10.—One
of the big surprises of the elec-
tion was the selection of
Dr. Geo. P. Kirt, Democrat, in this
(McKinley's) district, for con-
gress.

PENNSYLVANIA.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 10.—The
Pennsylvania revised returns give
Harrison 65,475 plurality, a Demo-
cratic gain of 15,350. The repre-
sentation in congress is 20 Republicans
and 10 Democrats.

DELAWARE.

WILMINGTON, Nov. 10.—Delaware
gives Cleveland a plurality of 614.

CONNECTICUT DEMOCRATIC.

HARTFORD, Nov. 10.—Cleveland's
plurality in the state is about 5000.
The congressional delegation is one
Republican and six Democrats. The
legislature is Republican on joint
ballot.

KANSAS.

TOPEKA, Nov. 10.—The next leg-
islature will be Republican by a small
majority on joint ballot.

Later, Democratic and Populist
state central committees claim Weav-
er and Jewelling carried the state,
by 8300 to 10,000. Conservative es-
timates are that Republican state
and electoral tickets are defeated and
not more than two or three Republi-
cans elected to congress out of 8, and
legislature in doubt. Harris is
elected congressman at large. He is
an ex-confederate and the first ex-
confederate elected to congress from
a Northern state.

HUCKEY'S IN DOUBT.

COLUMBUS, Nov. 10.—Democra-
tic committee have solicited
returns from 35 counties, and est-

imating results in other 12, claim
Cleveland carried the state by 1270
and that Taylor Democrat is elected
secretary of state by a greater plu-
rality. The Republican committee
has received word from all counties
except four, estimating results in
these, claim election of Taylor Re-
publican secretary of state by 1413
and that Harrison has carried the
state. Democrats elected 11 con-
gressmen, Republicans 10.

TEXAS DEMOCRATIC.

GALVESTON, Nov. 10.—The indi-
cations are that Hogg, the Demo-
cratic candidate for governor, is
elected by a small but safe majority.

OREGON.

PORTLAND, Nov. 10.—Three hun-
dred and thirty-four precincts in
Oregon, including the completed
counties of Multnomah, Washing-
ton and Yamhill, give the following
complete figures: Harrison 27,569,
Cleveland 10,242, Weaver 20,972. In
precincts giving Weaver 5510 votes
Pierce receives 8448. In some re-
mote country districts, where Mur-
phy's orders arrived too late, Pierce
did not receive the Democratic vote.

But in the larger number of pre-
cincts he overtops his ticket by a
good majority. In Multnomah
county alone he gained 800 over the
rest of the ticket.

Later: Plurality for Harrison elec-
tors will reach 8,000. Democrats
still maintain that Pierce, fusion
elector, is elected. Returns received
do not give his individual vote; im-
possible to form any estimate how
many Democratic votes he received.

Will probably take official canvass
to determine. In vote given Pierce
leads Weaver electors by about
4,000.

HILL'S SAYSO.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 10.—United
States Senator David B. Hill was
interviewed on the results of the
election. Hill rejoiced at the vic-
tory of the Democrats, and said:

"It is not only a personal triumph
for Mr. Cleveland and a just tribute
to him, but a vindication of the
Democratic principles which he
championed. I trust our victory
will carry with it the control of the
United States senate, which will en-
able us to place Democratic legisla-
tion upon the federal statute books.

We must carry out the pledges by
reforming the tariff and reducing
federal taxation, not by harsh and
extreme measures, but upon the
conservative lines indicated in our
platform and in the speeches of our
candidate. If we shall secure the
senate, we can show the people the
beneficial results of Democratic
policies, and the good we can accom-
plish will assure us power for many
years. I think the democracy
would prefer a vigorous aggressive
policy, and to that end the existing
federal election law should be re-
pealed. The manner in which it
was sought to be used against us by
our opponents election day furnishes
abundant argument for its repeal.

I am particularly gratified with the
glorious result in this state."

ALABAMA.

BIRMINGHAM, Nov. 10.—Cleve-
land's majority will be 35,000 to 40-
000. A solid Democratic delegation
elected to congress except possi-
bly in fifth district.

OHIO.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 10.—It will
take official returns to decide the
result on national and state tickets,
though chances are largely in favor
of Democratic state ticket. Unoffi-
cial returns received by both com-
mittees at Columbus vary a little.

MINNESOTA MORE CORRECT.

ST. PAUL, Nov. 10.—Partial re-
turns from 55 out of 80 counties and
estimates on remainder show Har-
rison's plurality 16,239. Not suffi-
cient returns at hand to indicate
whether four fusion electors are de-
feated or not. Democratic com-
mittee claim their election. Republi-
cans claim election of whole Re-
publican electoral ticket. Nelson,
Republican for governor, probably
elected by 10,000. Of seven con-
gressmen, Republicans claim five,
concede two, Democrats claim three
and another in doubt.

MONTANA.

BUTTE, Nov. 10.—Returns indi-
cate election of Republican national
state and congressional tickets.
Legislature probably Republican.
People's party drew largely from
Democrats.

WASHINGTON.

PORTLAND, Nov. 10.—Returns
from Washington are very slow
coming in. Indications are that
Republican electoral and state ticket
is elected by good plurality.

A GOOD MAN GETS IN.

BOSTON, Nov. 10.—Revised re-
turns give Russell, Democratic candidate
for governor, 1837 plurality.

LATEST FROM NEBRASKA.

OMAHA, Nov. 10.—45 out of 50
counties complete give Harrison

electors 6300 plurality over Weaver,
and indicate the state is at least
2000 Republican on national ticket.
Crounse and entire state ticket elect-
ed by 7000 to 10,000.

THE GOLDEN STATE.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 16.—Re-
turns indicate presidential vote will
be a narrow margin either way.
Sixteen hundred precincts give Har-
rison 101,727, Cleveland 104,201,
Weaver 18,033. Five hundred and
ninety-nine still to be heard from.

PERSONAL MENTION.

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—Chauncey
M. Depew says: "If Cleveland is
elected, I hope the Democracy will
have both branches of congress. If
he is elected it simply shows the
country has accepted the theory for
practice. Give the Democrats full
swing; let them have every oppor-
tunity to reduce their theory to
practice."

LONDON, Nov. 10.—The Duke of
Marborough was found dead in bed
at Blenheim place.

The Great Strike.

NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 10.—Govern-
or Foster this afternoon issued a
proclamation reciting disorganized
state of affairs here, calling on all
good citizens to assist in preserving
peace, and promising all power of
state to protect the city.

FOREIGN COMMENT.

LONDON, Nov. 10.—The Pall Mall
Gazette says both the merchants
and unemployed workmen of
England have reason to rejoice at
the Democratic victory, as with the
possibility of re-opening American
markets to the goods of England,
her capitalists will get a chance to
procure some return on their money
invested and workmen will have
an opportunity to get a decent price
for their labor without the necessity
of striking.

The St. James Gazette says some
satisfaction is felt in England at
Cleveland's going to the white house.
The Blaine-Harrison regime. It adds,
is far from agreeable to British in-
terests, and a majority of the Ameri-
can people believe it equally pre-
judicial to themselves.

PARIS, Nov. 10.—Le Temps, com-
menting upon the result of the
American election, says: "Seeing
that the campaign was fought
solely upon economic issues, it is
clear that Americans feel little if
any affection for the McKinley bill
and the beauties of protection. The
American people, it further says, also
for years past have perceived that
the Republican movement was ex-
hausted. There is no question of
principles at stake, and it is absurdly
futile to be carried away by the
memories of Grant and Lincoln to
meet the requirements of a unique
situation."

TORONTO, Ont., Nov. 10.—The
Empire, conservative, says: There
appears little doubt that Cleveland's
strong personal qualities and a ten-
dency to revolt from the McKinley
tariff were determining features of
the contest. The Globe, Liberal,
says: The result has lessons for all
who will read them. Everything
points to a great revulsion of feeling
against a high tariff.

Recent Crimes.

MONTGOMERY, Ala., Nov. 10.—
Judge F.C. Randolph, probate judge
of this county, shot and mortally
wounded William Metcalf Tuesday
night. The trouble is said to have
been political. Randolph is the
leading Democrat of the state.

JEWETT, Tex., Nov. 10.—News is
received of a fight at Leona, in
which Jim McKimmon and William
Rogers were shot and instantly
killed, and old man Manil and a
negro wounded. No particulars.

KANSAS CITY, Nov. 10.—A spe-
cial reports a train robbery on the
Santa Fe road, in Oklahoma, near
Guthrie. The southbound Santa
Fe train due there at 11:25 was held
up and robbed by five masked men
at Wharton station, in the Cherokee
strip, where a train had been robbed
before. When the train stopped the
bandits at once took possession, the
express car was cut loose, and the
engineer compelled to pull out a
mile. The robbers then blew the
door off with dynamite, badly shat-
tering the car, and after exchanging
a few shots with Messenger
Wagner and Guard Reibe, they en-
tered and attempted to blow open
the safe, but after working an hour
gave up as a bad job, and de-
parted. The only booty they ac-
quired was the arms of the trainmen
and a few small packages of ex-
press matter.

SITUATION AT MIDNIGHT.

More Complete Figures Now
at Hand.

WEAVER'S VOTE IS GROWING.

Ohio so Close as to Require
the Official Count.

DENVER, Nov. 10.—Returns from
about two-thirds of the counties in
Colorado give Weaver 22,593, Har-
rison 17,131, Weaver's majority 4862.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 10.—Demo-
cratic Chairman Wall says Cleve-
land and Peck are elected by about
13,000. Returns incomplete, but
will not make any material differ-
ence.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 10.—Seventy-
four out of 92 counties in Indiana, as
reported to Chairman Taggart, of
the Democratic state committee,
give Democratic gains over '88 of
8,743. It is estimated the net gain
in the other eighteen counties will
be 3,400, making a Democratic plu-
rality in the state of 9,743.

COLUMBUS, Nov. 10.—Indications
are that Ohio has gone Democratic
for the first time in a presidential
year, though it may require the of-
ficial count to determine the result.
At Republican headquarters they re-
ceived unofficial returns from all but
four counties. They claim a plural-
ity of 116 at Republican headquar-
ters and concede it will require the
official count to determine the mat-
ter.

TOPEKA, Nov. 10.—Returns al-
ready in show that Weaver has car-
ried the state by about 2000, that
Lewellyn (fusion), for governor, will
have a majority over Smith (Republi-
can) of about 1,500; that Sarraz,
fusion candidate at large for con-
gress, will beat Anthony (Republi-
can) by 1000 majority, and the con-
gressional delegation will stand five
fusion-populists and three Republi-
cans. Jerry Simpson is returned by
about 2,500, a reduction of his ma-
jority two years ago by 3,500 votes.

TACOMA, Nov. 10.—Computation
made at midnight from all the re-
turns received including sixty-one
precincts from King county, all of
Pierce county except thirty-one pre-
cincts, six of which are in the city
of Tacoma, and all of Whatcom
county, give Harrison 22,653, Cleve-
land 17,601, Weaver 10,983. Mc-
Graw for governor 17,037, Snively
17,555, Young 14,100. These figures
indicate that Harrison will carry
the state by over 7000, and that
Snively will be elected governor by
probably 1000 plurality.

South American Republics May
Go to War.

PANAMA, Nov. 10.—According to
advices from Chili, war is imminent
between the Argentine Republic
and Peru on one side, and Chili on
the other.
