Little Danger of Early Division.

Springfield Messenger: Lane county should never be divided by an east and west line, because such a division would not benefit either county. When we size up the county, we find it extends over 100 miles from east to west, and fifty miles from north to south. An east and west division would practically give us two counties 25x100 miles in size—a division plan so absurd, that the legislature would refuse to consider it. Such a division would be of no benefit to the taxpayers in the eastern and western parts of the two counties, still being far distant from their respective county seats. Such a division would smack of selfish motives and utter disregard of public good. In dividing a county the only object in view should be to promote the common welfare of all the inhabitants thereof. If the country is ever divided, it will be by a north and south line, making two counties, each fifty miles square. However, there is little danger of an early division of old Lane by even a north and south line, while the east and west propositions is too ridiculous to merit the slightest degree of consideration.

The Brussels Conference.

LONDON, Dec. 5.—Only a moderate degree of interest is felt here in proceedings of the monetary conference in Brussels. The gold standard is so firmly established that nobody believes for a moment that it can be disturbed. Consequently the discussions in Brussels are regarded as partaking of a doctrinal rather than of a practical business character, and very few persons in this city appear even to have followed them. Bertram Currie undoubtedly gave expression to the opinions of the government, the Bank of England and the commercial English world generally, when he roundly declared that the gold standard would eventually triumph even in the United States. At any rate England can not and will not change it. It is the opinion of almost all who have real influence in city's affairs that the conference can only end in one way, so far as this country is concerned, and a majority of the other delegates are evidently prepared to take the same ground.
