THE LEGISLATURE. HOUSE—2 P. M., JAN. 24. Bishop moved to reconsider vote passing house bill 41, relating to marriage and it was returned to his committee. BILL PASSED. H. B. No. 56. By Merritt, fixing compensation of certain county officers.
