Willamette Finances. At a number of meetings of the trustees of Willamette university the erection of several residences on the east end of the campus, now used for a nursery, was deferred for a short time until plans can be considered. J. H. Rook was authorized to receive subscriptions to an actual expense fund to meet the working necessities of the school, which is at least \$3000 a year. The fund is to be subscribed for three years, payable annually towards subsistence. General Odell was also empowered to fund the present debt at six and a half percent.

County Court. Joseph Scheurer appointed road supervisor, district No. 39, in place of G. A. Ehler, not residing in district. The report of the viewers of the Frank Herren road was read second time. Mrs. Bumhuber, a widow of Mt. Angel, was granted pecuniary aid. Matilda J. Cross' petition for relief of John Bailly, aged 97, was granted and he was placed on a regular monthly allowance of \$8. Hold a State Convention at Salem

BANQUETED BY THE CAPITAL CITY CLUB.

Officers Elected and Organization Completed.

A very fine body of sportsmen met in Salem Friday evening. To be a sportsman nowadays means to be a gentleman in the true sense of the word, a man who respects the rights of others, one who is prepared to uphold the laws and in the pursuit of harmless sport seeks recreation and health.

State Sportsmen's convention met at Hotel Willamette, about fifty delegates of state rod and gun clubs and sportsmen's associations present. Capt. W. J. Rolly, of Portland, was called to the chair. He made a brief statement of the purposes of meeting. Mr. Pogue was asked to become secretary. Mr. Story proposed the constitution and by-laws of the Northwestern Sportsmen's organization.

Chair appointed Messrs. Gabrielson, Bartlett and Barin as committee on revision of constitution and by-laws. The committee reported complete rules and by-laws, stating object to be the pleasure, recreation and improvement of its members, as well as to aid in enforcement of game and fish laws. One or more state shooting tournaments are to be held annually. The officers are to be a president, five vice presidents, five directors, and a secretary and treasurer. Three representatives are to be allowed each club, or their proxies. Any member convicted of violating the game or fish laws to be expelled, two delegates to national convention. Constitution adopted. Adjournment was taken to a banquet.

Secretary, F. Howe of Salem; Treasurer, F. A. Turner, of Salem; Directors, J. B. Seed, F. A. Dunham, G. M. Stearns, W. Breyman, M. A. McCorkle. The convention adjourned at a late hour this morning.

NOTES. Captain Riley made a splendid presiding officer.

Col. Wagner's dinner was complimented by men from all over the state, and it was unanimously voted that the Willamette was easily the second in the state and that man a good deal. The game and fish were both in season and out of season.

The Salem men were highly praised for their enterprise in managing state tournaments in the past. They will give the state association a surprise party at the next one too.

Mr. Gabrielson and his local assistants will leave nothing undone to build up the state association.

The state association is strongly pledged to the enforcement of the game and fish laws and song birds as well.

WHO MAY VOTE MONDAY.

Legal Opinion and Court Decisions

UPON SOME INTERESTING QUESTIONS

Answered Succinctly By a Salem Attorney.

There have been many inquiries at this office as to conduct of next Monday's school election, and qualifications of electors entitled to vote.

A JOURNAL writer formulated these questions and submitted them to Samuel Richardson, Dean of the law faculty of Willamette University. The questions are answered as follows:

THE QUESTIONS ANSWERED.

Should the Australian ballot be used at the school election in order to make it legal?

No.—The Australian ballot law only applies to elections held for the state, county and precinct officers. Our school law simply requires that the election shall be by ballot. See sec. 34 page 26 and sec. 79 page 43, compiled school laws of 1891.

Is it necessary before a person is entitled to vote at a school meeting to have property and pay a tax?

No.—The constitution of Oregon, article 2 sections 2, 3 and 4, defines who are qualified voters at all elections and any voter who has resided in the district 30 days immediately before the election is entitled to vote at the school election, no matter whether he owns property or not or pays a tax.

Don't you think that section 43 of the school law requires that a person to be entitled to vote must pay a tax in the district, which law reads as follows: "In all school districts in this state with a population of one thousand and upwards, any citizen of this state shall be entitled to vote at a school meeting who is 21 years of age, and has resided in the district 30 days immediately preceding the meeting, and who has property in the district upon which he or she pays a tax?"

No.—This section is intended not only to let all male voters vote, but it is intended to allow women who have property upon which they pay a tax to vote also. It does not say that a male voter who does not pay a tax shall not vote, but by its reading it does say that a woman can vote, if she owns property in the district and pays a tax. If a law were passed by the legislature making property qualifications necessary to entitle a male person to vote it would be void. Our supreme court and also the courts of many other states have held—that where a constitution of a state fixes the qualification of a voter, no law can be valid that makes any additional qualifications necessary to vote unless the constitution also provides that the legislature may make additional qualifications necessary. In support of this proposition I refer you to the following cases; Morris vs Powell 125, Ind. 281; Quinn vs State 35, Ind. 489; Rison vs Farr 24, Ark. 161; Barker vs People 3, Cow 689; People vs Canady 73, N. C. 198; State vs Constantine 42, Ohio St. 437; Daggett vs Hudson 43, Ohio St. 548; White vs Multnomah county commissioners 12, Or. 317; Kinneen vs Wells 144, Mass. 497; State vs Corner 22, Neb. 295; St Joseph & D. C. R. Co. vs Buchanan County Ct. 39, Mo. 485; State vs Williams, 5, Wis. 308.
