A Moth Preventive. A pleasant perfume and moth preventive is made of cloves, caraway seeds, nutmeg, mace, cinnamon and Tonquin beans, of each an ounce. Add as much Florentineorris root as will equal the other ingredients. Put together, grind all to a powder and put in little bags among your clothes.

Good Old Gingerbread. Take 2 parts of flour, a half pound of lard, 1 pound of sugar, 1 cup of molasses, 2 eggs, 3 teaspoonfuls of baking powder, a little ginger and a pinch of salt, and mix thoroughly and bake in a good oven even.

Cake Telling. Icing for cakes may be prevented from cracking when being cut by adding one teaspoonful of sweet cream to each un-baked egg, beat all together and add sugar until as stiff as can be stirred.

DISINFECTANTS.
