

The financial situation in Oregon is decidedly improved. There never has been any danger at Salem. The failures at Albany and Corvallis are being adjusted. If the state treasury insisted upon what is due the state in taxes there would be a general suspension. Those best posted here seem to think the financial flurry is over in Oregon. In Eastern Oregon mining interests are apparently well protected. In Southern Oregon a great deal of gold is taken out and there have been no failures. Pendleton banks are sending in good reports.
