ANTI-SILVER CONSPIRACY!
Bimetallic League Calls a National Convention.
ASSISTANT ANARCHIST GOV. ALTGELD Scored by Commander Campbell of the Illinois G. A. R.

WASHINGTON, July 3.—The bimetallic league will issue a call today for a convention at Chicago July 25. The call will denounce the conspiracy against silver, and set forth the evils to result from its demotion, inveigh against the gold standard, and depict the benefits to accrue by uniting the parity of the two metals. The convention will be purely one of ways and means to prevent a repeal of the Sherman law.

Scoring Altgeld.
CHICAGO, July 3.—Governor Altgeld was rather severely scored at the patriotic Sunday exercises at the world's fair grounds for his recent action in pardoning the anarchists. The services were conducted in the festival hall, under the auspices of the regular army and navy unit. About 1000 people were in attendance. Commander J. M. Campbell, in an address, said: "It is eminently fitting that the union should observe 'patriotic Sunday' today, because the chief executive of this state has recently shown he would be willing to supplant the flag of freedom with the red flag of anarchy." At this point the audience burst into a long round of applause. The commander made no further reference to the governor or pardon, and at the conclusion of his address the choir sang, "Nearer, My God, to Thee." Then the huge American flag which hung behind the speaker's stand was drawn aside and there upon the wall hung the Union Jack draped in crepe in memory of the unfortunate English ship Victoria. A sailor in the uniform of the United States navy stepped forward and hung a laurel wreath above the flag while the bugler sounded "taps."
