

Serious Trouble is Imminent Over Labor Riots.

Sealing Controversy Closed-Fight With Arabs in Congo Land-

Paris, July 8.—The city was quiet resterday, but it is a brooding quietness that augurs ill for order when darkness sets in. The situation promises to become critical, and only the administra-BUZZARDS BAY, July 8.—Pres. Cleve- tion of the law with a strong hand will prevent general troubles; but it can be prepared for almost any contingency. World's Fair Rates.

CHICAGO, July 8 .- The western roads have finally backed down on the question of world's fair rates, and seven and eleven day excursions from all points in the Western Passenger association territory are now assured. The association meeting was taken up entirely by discussion and arrangement of excursions. The committee of world's fair exhibitors urged the establishment of a one-fair rate and after they were withdrawn and the suggestion discussed the report for a one-fare rate without restrictions was adopted with but one negative vote. The first sale of tickets is to be made July 17th. Another meeting of the association will be held August 1st and such action will be one-fare tickets as the July excursions shall warrant.

Short Wheat Crop.

TOLEDO, O., July 8.-Reports from grain dealers and millers covering six principal wheat producing states, producing two-thirds of total crop, indicate that they will furnish about 150,000,000 bushels this year, against 230,000,000 last year.
