NEWPORT, Ore., Sept. 25.—I have spent the past week with catching salmon in Yaquina Bay, exploring Lincoln county and introducing the OREGON DAILY to over a hundred new readers.

Lincoln county is sending daily shipments of sea fish, shell fish, hivalves, trout and game from her mountain valleys, the only perfect apples, blackberries, and grows sweet potatoes, so in any variety be called the Deltaic county of Oregon.
