

The launch was entirely successful, and the new battleship now lies in a little lagoon in front of completion which will be pushed as rapidly as possible.

DESCRIPTION OF THE SHIP.

The Oregon is what is technically known as a sea-going coast line battleship, and is the most powerful ship in the United States navy. She will have a maximum speed of sixteen and twotenths knots, and will carry a crew of four hundred and sixty men.

The cost, exclusive of armament will be four million dollars. The arm consists of four 13-inch, eight 8-inch and four sixteen breech-loading rifles; also a second battery of a twenty-sixmounted in turrets.
