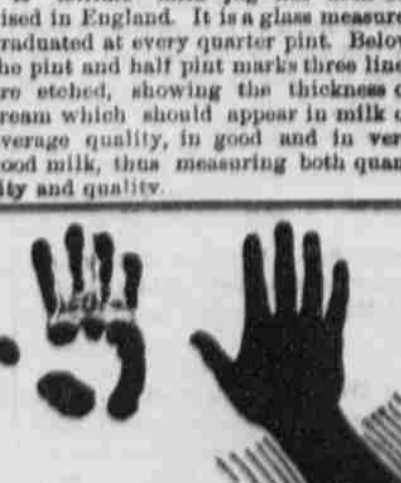
The great auk is another species of bird but recently extinct. The most remarkable thing about this large auk is the fabulous prices now asked and given for specimens of its eggs.
