**THE COAST'S SENATORS**  
A Portland Paper on Committee Places.

**THE COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE**  
Is Coveted in the Interest of Senator Squire.

There is some interest in the following, owing to the notorious fact that the Portland Oregonian is seeking to manipulate the places of Pacific coast senators in the interest of the great corporations.

A Washington special to the Oregonian of July 12 says:

"The bids fair to be quite a contest among the Republican members of the senate from the Pacific coast states for the position on the committee on commerce, which has heretofore been held by Senator Dolph, of Oregon. It is understood that Senators Perkins, of California, McBride, of Oregon, and Squire of Washington would each like to secure the appointment, while Senator Wilson, of Washington, would accept the position if tendered him, and Senator Mitchell, of Oregon, might take it under certain conditions. The place is considered one of special importance, as the committee deals with all questions of commerce which come before the senate, and acts in an advisory capacity to the appropriations committee for river and harbor improvements. There are naturally many places along the Pacific coast from Puget sound to the Mexican border which seek preference at the hands of congress, and the rivalry between them is quite sharp. The possibility of the extension of the trade of the United States with Oriental countries also enhances the importance of the appointment in the eyes of Western men. Being the oldest senator of the five mentioned and coming from the same state that Senator Dolph has represented, Senator Mitchell could probably secure the position if disposed to accept it at the sacrifice of some other important committee assignment. He occupies a peculiarly commanding position on the senate committee, standing as he does at the head of the Republican representation on the committee on claims, postoffices and privileges and elections.

It is understood among his colleagues that he would prefer to allow his own assignments to remain as they are if he could secure the appointment of his colleague, Mr. McBride, to the commerce vacancy. He realizes, however, that it will be difficult to secure for a new member an assignment of the importance of this, and one which is sought by older senators. Senator Perkins will be met with the objection that Senator White, of his own state is now a member of the committee. Mr. Wilson, of Washington, is not a candidate in the ordinary sense, but some of his friends are urging his fitness for the place. The same objections which apply in Mr. McBride's case would hold in Mr. Wilson's. The latter would enjoy a slight advantage from the circumstances of having served in the house, before his election to the senate.

At present, therefore the chances seem most favorable to Senator Squire's candidacy. The selection would depend on the turn affairs may take at the beginning of the next session, and it is impossible to fathom to whom the assignment will go. There is little or no doubt, however, that some one on the Pacific coast will be appointed to the place.

The Oregonian's editorial says:

"What senator is it to succeed to the position on the senate's committee on commerce that would have fallen to Senator Dolph, had he been re-elected? This is the committee of almost importance to Oregon, as The Oregonian pointed out last winter. Mr. Squire, of Washington, by reason of his seniority, will probably get the headship of this committee, and Oregon's enterprise will be permitted to wait. The dispatch today from Washington will afford interesting reading for Oregon."

The only inference is that Oregon has suffered a great loss by the defeat of Senator Dolph, that Senator Squire will be preferred on the committee on commerce in place of Senator McBride, and that Oregon enterprise will be "permitted to wait."

Eastern senators should understand that the Portland Oregonian's opinion in this matter is not shared by the people of Oregon, and that the profusions of that paper are unscrupulous and dictated at all times by the South-

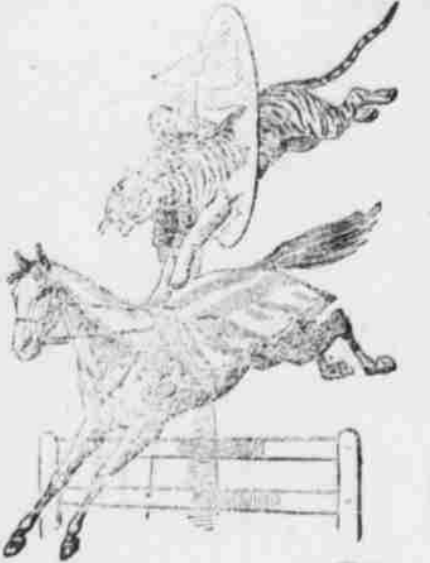
