Great Improvement Along the O. C. & E. Railroad.

A trip up the old Oregon Pacific, which is now known as the Oregon Central & Eastern, at this season of the year is a treat long to be remembered.

Our little party spent Sunday at De trol, now the last station on the road. The track is laid to Idanha, but trains are only run up there semi-occasionally.

There are at present four sawmills above the big Shaw mill at Mill City, located respectively at Gatesville, Minto, Niagara and Detroit.

There are no more claims being taken up in this section of the country, as the Cascade Forest Reserve excludes any further settlement.

Some of the claim owners near the sawmills are now realizing a fine price for their timber. They get 50 cents a thousand for it on the stump, and thus average about \$50 per acre.

Gates has hopes of becoming a lively town, on account of the mining boom at Quartzville. The road to the mines branches off at Gates, and all traffic must go through here.
