One car of German prupes, a car of Italians and Silver prones, and one car of mixed plums, erabapples and apples, which were shipped without our knowledge, proved losses to the growers. In the instance of the Gertotu, Italian and Silver prunes, the fruit was soft and rips, both cars were from Southern Oregon. The car of Italians and Silvers on arrival in Portland showed signs of rot necessitating the whole car being unpacked.




