The above table of figures, compiled from the official government statistics, shows that for three years of Democratic rule and five years of rebellion from 1860 to 1865 inclusive there was a deficit in the national treasury. From 1866 to 1873 inclusive there was a Republican surplus to apply to wiping out the national debt. Cleveland went in March 4, 1893, and for that year the surplus nearly disappeared. In 1894 and 1895 the deficit due to Democratic mismanagement of revenues and finances ran up to over \$112,000,000. Draw your own conclusions.


