have an ample revenue, with a sufficient sur-

plus over ordinary expenditures to provide for coast defences, for the steady building up of the pavy, and for the constant reduction of the public debt. We believe that the present tariff, with its lowered rates and its destructive and dishonest system of undervaluations and discriminations as to localities, should be replaced by one framed on protective princi-ples similar to that of the McKinley bill and arranged to give ample protection to American wages and American industry, and to restore the reciprocity policy of James G.

We have always given protection to our shipbuilders. In late years we have neglected to protect our shipowners. We believe the Washington and Hamilton, which, by dis-criminating duties in favor of American bot-toms, secured 90 per cent of our carrying trade to American ships, and which, if now restored, would again revive our shipping and cause American freights to be paid to Ameri-

The American people, from tradition and interest, favor bimetalism, and the Republican party demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money with such restrictunder such provisions to be deter ired by legislation, as will secure the main-tenance of the parity of values of the two metals, so that the purchasing and debt-pay-ing power of the dollar, whether of silver, gold or paper, shall be at all times equal.

The interest of the producers of the country -its farmers and its workingmen-demand that every dollar, paper or coin, issued by the government shall be as good as any other

It is moreover of special importance to our Pacific states and we demand its completion as speedly as possible by the government of the United States.

We demand the enactment of rigid restrictions on foreign immigration, both for protection of our country against illiterate and vicious classes from foreign lands and for protection of our labor and preservation to our own people of the remainder of our national domain.
