REPUBLICAN PLATFORM.

The representatives of the Republicans of the state of Oregon in convention assembled, call attention to the condition of industry throughout the country, as a proof of the necessity of returning to the policy of the Re-publican party under which there was general

prosperity during thirty years.

We reaffirm the principles of the Republican national platform of 1892, and assert that the results that have followed the change decreed by the election of that year have justi fied our protest against the national policy alopted by the Democratic party.

We believe that the government should have an ample revenue, with a sufficient surplus over ordinary expenditures to provide for coast defences, for the steady building up of the navy, and for the constant reduction of the public debt. We believe that the present tariff, with its lowered rates and its destruc tive and dishonest system of undervaluations and discriminations as to localities, should be replaced by one framed on protective princi-ples similar to that of the McKinley bill and arranged to give ample protection to American wages and American industry, and to restore the reciprocity policy of James G.

We have always given protection to our shipbuilders. In late years we have neglected to protect our shipowners. We believe the time has come to restore to the policy of Washington and Hamilton, which, by dis-criminating duties in favor of American bottoms, secured 90 per cent of our carrying trade to American ships, and which, if now restored, would again revive our shipping and cause American freights to be paid to Ameri-

The American people, from tradition and interest, favor bimetalism, and the Republican party demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money with such restrict-ions and under such provisions to be determ-ined by legislation, as will secure the maintenance of the parity of values of the two metals, so that the purchasing and debt-pay-ing power of the dollar, whether of silver, gold or paper, shall be at all times equal.

The interest of the producers of the country-its farmers and its workingmen-demand that every dollar, paper or coin, issued by the government shall be as good as any other dollar.

Resolved, That we earnestly endorse the proposed amendment to the constitution of the United States, providing for the election of United States senators by popular vote, recently reported from the committee on privileges and elections by Senator Mitchell and now pending consideration in the United State senates.

Resolved, That the application of the Oregon delegation in congress to the president of the United States and now pending before him, praying a modification of his procla-sation creating the Cascade forest reserve, is hereby earnestly approved, and we appeal to the president to grant the prayer of our dele-ration in congress gation in congress

We realize the importance and magnitude of the fishing industry on the Columbia river and would recommend that some provisions be made for a state hatchery for artificial propagation, and that the laws regulating the need season be rigidly enforced.

That we endorse the efforts of our repre-

sensitives in congress to secure repayment to the settlers of Oregon of the excess of \$1.25 per acre wrongfully collected by the governt ment on lands located in the limits of the mearned Northern Pacific railroad land gran-aow forfeited. now forfeited.

The construction of the Nicaragua canal is of the highest importance to the American people, both as a measure of national defense and to build up and maintain American commerce. It is moreover of special importance to our Pacific states and we demand its completion as specially as possible by the completion as speedly as possible by the covernment of the United States.

We hereby endorse the action of our sena-

tors and representatives in congress in their endeavor to secure grants of pensions to ladian

We pledge the Republican party to a rigid economy in the expenditure of public money; to the reduction of excessive salaries; and the abolishment of the fee system whenever possible, and of all usels a commissions; and believe that no appropriation should be made to any school or charitable institution not under the control of the state; and oppose the incorporation into the general appropriation

incorporation into the general appropriation bill of items for the expenditure of public assess and the characteristic assess of our country against illiterate and vicious classes from foreign lands and for protection of our country against illiterate and vicious classes from foreign lands and for protection of our labor and preservation to our own people of the remainder of our national domain.

We commend the policy of the Republican party in relation to internal improve-ments, and in particular in opening our saterways to commerce, and we denounce the illiberality of Democratic party in these m-portant matters. portrat matters.
