Gets Its Share. When the Job bank of Corvallis failed in June 1893 there was on deposit in it \$1,199.92 belonging to Lincoln county. The bank has paid three ten per cent dividends. A suit was brought to recover the full amount on the grounds that it was a trust fund. It has been hotly contested for about three years, with no end to the number of demurrers made. Judge Fullerton has just rendered a final decision allowing the county its pro rata share of thirty per cent, the same as other depositors, and it will thus probably get enough to pay its attorneys.
