ARISTOCRATS.

Display of Feeling in the Forum Articles.

ED. JOURNAL: Those who have not read a symposium in the December Forum, about the result of the presidential election, might be instructed by doing so. It gives, no doubt with considerable fairness the feeling and purpose of the conservative party.

It is by eminent men; the first article being by Pres. Andrew D. White, the next by David McGregor Means, and the last by Goldwin Smith, of Ontario; they all agree in their tenor of the silver movement; in a hardly restrained abuse of Tillman, Altgeld and Bryan, no name of hate or contempt, or ridicule being too bad to imply, and in refusal to discuss the merits of the contention.

In this last respect they are remarkable. The assumption made at the beginning of the campaign that remonetization of silver is dishonesty, repudiation and national dishonor. They will not even allow the question to be discussed, but stamp down inquiry with the intolerance of a Spanish inquisition. One might suppose that now, after the immediate peril is over, such men would consent to show why silver remonetization is such an abused policy, and meet with deliberate argument the statement of Bryan. "Col." G. Fred Williams, Prof. Frank Parsons and the many other able and candid silver men who see neither dishonesty or repudiation in restoring silver, or indeed in entirely reforming our currency system on a national, not a corporate, basis. But no, they will not degrade themselves to even recognize any silver man however eminent as an equal; or to allow the assumption that any other man can speak anything but heresy.

This troupe of evidently able and true gold men is perhaps the most significant thing of the time. It reminds one of the medieval Catholics, the Cavaliers of England, the Bourbon of France, or the slave-holders of America during the last days of their power.

President White lays the uprising of the west and south chiefly to ignorance. The people of these sections do not use "right reason;" they fail to come to goldite conclusions. Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska and other silver states seem to him in need of mental training. Otherwise, how should they differ so from him in their logic? He proposes as a remedy vast endowments of educational institutions, in

the infected districts. The treatment of Bryan by college men—he does not especially mention Yale shows to him that colleges do exert a voluntary influence developing right reason.
