OTHER LEGISLATURES.

Gov. Jones, of Arkansas, has signed the bill guaranteeing against Missouri horses and mules.

The Populists in the Kansas legislature talk of passing a law to prohibit the use of type-setting machines in that state.

The State Supreme Court of Nevada has decided that the state courts have no jurisdiction over offences committed on government property.

Hartman of Montana, has introduced a bill in Congress appropriating \$100,000 for the education of Seely savages of Manhattan reservation.

Senator McMillan has introduced a resolution in the United States Senate declaring "The Star Spangled Banner" to be the national song of the United States.

President Eliot, of Harvard University, has invited Secretary Olney to fill the chair of international law at that institution after the expiration of his term of office as Secretary of State.

Gov. Bradley, of Kentucky, will call an extra session of the legislature for the election of a successor to Senator Blackburn, and other important legislation. The date has not yet been decided upon.

A bill was introduced in the Oklahoma legislature recently which prohibits drunkards and habitual users of opium and morphine from holding office, getting married or teaching school.

The single taxpayers have a bill before the New York legislature. It provides that taxes for local purposes may be levied upon personal property alone, upon land alone, upon land and improvements, or upon land, improvements and personal property.

Missouri Legislature, provides that, "where any person dies from the negligence of any servant or employee of any coach the corporation or person so owning such road or coach shall pay to the widow or family of the deceased \$5000."

The house of the Arkansas legislature has passed a bill, by a vote of 26 to 4, which reduces the present express rates in Arkansas just one half. The senate also has passed a bill, by a vote of 26 to 4, requiring railroad companies to carry bicycles as baggage.

A bill is pending before the Tennessee legislature requiring railroads to issue mileage books of 1000 miles at 2c per mile. Any railroad refusing to comply with the law shall forfeit \$100, to be recovered by the party by whom the demand for such transportation is made.

The Alabama legislature passed a bill on Saturday which renders void all contracts made with a view to lessen free competition in the sale, importation or manufacture of articles of domestic production or of raw material. Violation of law subjects the offender to both fine and imprisonment.

Among the special pension bills of peculiar interest pending in the United States Senate is one introduced last week to increase pensions of surviving soldiers of the war of 1812 to \$30 per month, and another bill proposing a pension for Cassius M. Clay, of Kentucky, at \$100 per month.

A bill has been introduced in the Kansas legislature placing the control of the live stock commission business in the hands of the state, requiring commission men to secure a certificate from the Secretary of State and reducing present rates of commission 50 per cent.

A bill has passed the House of the Arkansas legislature by a vote of 59 to 20 which provides that the passenger rates on all railroads in Arkansas shall be as follows: Boods of fifteen miles or less in length, 6c; fifteen to twenty-five miles, 8c; twenty-five to fifty miles, 10c; fifty to seventy-five miles, 12c; over 75, 15c. The present rate on the latter roads is 3c.

WARLIKE.

Demonstrations Continue In Greece Preparing for a Brush With Turkey.

ATHENS, Greece, Feb. 13.—(Copyrighted, 1897, by the Associated Press).—The warlike excitement has increased with the departure of the troops for the frontier and the equipping of additional war vessels for service in Cretan waters. Nobody seems to doubt that a clash of arms will occur between Greece and Turkey unless the powers intervene, but it is believed here that Greece will be given a free hand in Crete and that if she succeeds in annexing that island her right to do will not be questioned by the rest of Europe. It is quite certain that King George has not acted without consulting his friends in sending the torpedo flotilla into Cretan waters with instructions to prevent at all hazards the landing of Turk troops in Crete. The ports are understood to have appealed to the powers to restrain Greece in this emergency, but nothing further is known of the policy Turkey is adopting, though it is reported that a large force of Turkish troops is assembling at Salonika for embarkation to Crete; that there is great activity in military circles on the Turkish frontier, and that a portion of the Turkish fleet is being prepared for active service.

Killing Turks.—LONDON, Feb. 13.—A dispatch to the Times from Sitta, reports 13 villages now in flames. Christians are killing the Mohammedan inhabitants. Those who have succeeded in escaping from the scene of the massacre are flocking to Sitta, which is still in possession of the Turks. It is feared this news will produce a dangerous reaction at Heraklion.

The Arlington house at Junction City was entirely consumed by fire Wednesday morning. As the train passed the city at 3:40 a. m., the hotel was in flames. The fire company was laboring in vain against it with a weak stream from one nozzle.

S. H. Horton, writing to the Corvallis Times, says that the only survivor of the four Benton county members of the Oregon constitutional convention is Hon. H. B. Nichols, who lives quietly on his farm west of Monroe. Mr. Nichols was a member of the constitutional convention, a member of the last territorial legislature, and a member from Benton county of the first state legislature. He is now almost 80 years of age.
