

ADJOURNMENT.

Action Taken by Both Houses

Legislative Bluffing to Force an Organization.

SENATE TUESDAY AFTERNOON. Immediately after rollcall Reed offered a resolution, that the senate adjourn sine die at noon Wednesday, February 24. After stating the question, the president stated that until the house is permanently organized, he ruled the resolution out of order. Reed stated that he desired to appeal from the ruling of the chair. Immediately Driver arose to speak in favor of the resolution. He told how he could throw aside all his personal animosities, but believed the entire senate was not in such a frame of mind. Johnson tried to call Driver to order, but he didn't call. Driver proceeded to favor the resolution, and made one of the best tempered speeches he has made this session.

Dufur then spoke for the affirmative stating that the senate had now tried for 44 days to carry out its pledges, and that as all efforts seemed fruitless he wanted to go home. He cited that the chair had recognized the Davis house arbitrarily, and at the same time had declined to show any recognition of the Benson house. He stigmatized both houses as "the dog in the manger." He, however, claimed, upon his reputation as a lawyer, that the Benson house is legally organized FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES, but not for the passage of laws. He thought the seats of certain members were vacant. He praised Governor Lord as a jurist, and wished him to judge if they were or were not vacant, and act accordingly.

Carter next arose, stating that Driver had made a remark which impressed him, but Driver denied the allegation and the youthful senator from Benton reiterated.

Selling reiterated his words of two weeks ago, that the legislature was here, not to legislate, but simply to elect a senator. He told how the Mitchell men had agreed to drop the senatorial question and proceed with business, and expressed regret that they were not now willing to do it.

Patterson asked if Selling did not desire the defeat of a certain senator more than he did the enactment of legislation, which the latter immediately denied.

Brownell then took the floor, quoting Blackstone against the ruling of the president of the senate. He talked dispassionately, but lost his point.

He said this legislature was the most disgraceful in the history of the state, and he wanted to go home and hide his head in a hay stack. But he took occasion to tell of his great work for the people. He charged that the opposition were using their efforts to prevent the election of a senator who will try to give us protection and the Niarnugua canal, and who will support Pres. McKinley in carrying out the new doctrine of prosperity.

Driver jumped to a question of privilege when Selling began to speak. Reed denied what Selling said that the Mitchell men had no desire but to elect Mitchell, senator. He claimed that I will vote for whomsoever I damn please. He closed by appealing "for God's sake, Mr. President, let me go home."

Mitchell made one of the best speeches of the session, both from the standpoint of law and common sense. He asked which was paramount to the interests of the people, the election of one man or remedial legislation. He resented the imputation that this legislature was a blot upon the state. Positively he stated that it had done nothing; negatively it had not elected John H. Mitchell, senator. If that is a blot upon the state, the speaker said he was ready to bear his share of the responsibility.

Mulkey spoke, stating that while he was elected a Mitchell man he didn't propose to recognize the Benson house as legal in order to carry out that pledge. The speaker would not parade the flag to bolster up his statements, but thought it was sometimes

used too commonly. He cited how the chairman of the railroad committee had reported favorably upon abolishing the railroad commission, and now wants to adjourn before it can pass.

McClung upon voting stated that he thought the Mitchell men if they want to adjourn ought to dissolve the unorganized end of the legislature.

McClung offered to amend by providing that the senate adjourn sine die when the senate decides that the house cannot organize. The resolution was adopted by 13 to 17.

May Vote in Some Districts.

Having a Population of Over 1000 Citizens.

In the matter of school district No. 16 of Douglas county, Oregon. Appeal from the decision of the county superintendent of Douglas county, in dividing district No. 16 of said county.

A W. Stanton and I. B. Nichols Appellants. Directors of district No. 16, vs. Douglas Waite, Respondent. County school superintendent of Douglas county.

The above named appellants appealed from the order made by the respondent on the 20th day of November, 1896, dividing school district No. 16, and using the part taken therefrom in connection with a portion of district No. 14, and forming a new district.

The ground alleged for said appeal is that the petition presented to Douglas Waite, county superintendent of Douglas county, did not contain a majority of all the legal voters of said district No. 16, as required by law, before a county superintendent can divide or in any way change the boundaries of school districts.

In the consideration of the matter who constitutes legal voters, it is deemed advisable to procure the opinion of the attorney general, upon the question of competency, and upon two points of this question, as it applies to school districts of less than one thousand inhabitants, he has given the following as his opinion:

"In districts having a population of more than 1,000, besides age and time of residence, the only qualification is that the elector have property upon which he or she pays a tax. In districts of less than 1,000, if the electors have no property upon which they pay tax, they may still be allowed the right to vote, provided they have children of school age to educate.

Upon this qualification there can be no question. The language of the statute in both instances is: 'that any citizen of this state shall be entitled to vote, etc.' This includes both male and female, and if the conditions expressed in the statute exist, it undoubtedly includes both husband and wife."

It becomes apparent from all facts that can be gathered and from the law as interpreted by the Attorney General, that said petition presented to the county superintendent on the 20th day of November, 1896, did not contain a majority of the legal voters at that time residing in said school district No. 16 of Douglas County, Oregon, and the decision of the county superintendent dividing said district is hereby reversed.

DOUBLE-TUBE TIRES IN ENGLAND

Ninety-seven out of every hundred pneumatic tires in use in England are double-tube tires, and believers in the double-tube pattern somewhat scornfully say that a single-tube tire is nothing but a double-tube with the inner tube stuck fast to the outer one.

In the United States at least 65 per cent of all pneumatic tires are made by one firm—Morgan & Wright, Chicago. They have never made single-tube tires, and their experience should, it seems, be of some value to new riders who do not know what form of tire to try. About ten per cent of the tires in the country are of the clincher and other varieties of the double-tube style. The remaining twenty-five per cent is divided among all the single-tube makers—and it is a notable fact that, although by far the greatest number of the tire makers make single-tube tires, three-quarters of the demand is for double-tube tires.

Recently, Col. Pope, the father of bicycle manufacturing in this country, and interested in a single-tube tire factory as well, was quoted on his return from England as saying the single-tube tire was taking strong hold there. The president of another big bicycle company was similarly quoted on his recent return from Europe. These printed interviews seemed odd to an inquisitive newspaper man and bicycle rider, who knew that single-tube tires had made a hard fight in Europe for several years and had finally, according to all reports given up the ghost. This newspaper man wrote to one of the most prominent cycling journals in the world, published in London. He got this reply:

DEAR SIR:—In reply to your favour of the 10th. You can take it from me that the quotation referred to may be summed up in a very short word of three letters which begins with L and ends with E. As a matter of fact, to the best of my knowledge, there is not one first-class, or even second or third-

class, house in this country using even so much as a single-tube tire, except to special order. The only single-tube tires which are used here are used by the "garret" makers who, as they can procure them for three or four dollars the pair, are thus enabled to sell machines "fitted with pneumatic tires" at five or six pounds. Yours faithfully, etc.

The Cyclist, of London, recently contained this item: Colonel Pope is reported to have said after his recent visit to England, that single-tube tires were gaining converts every day, and that the old prejudice against them was flying out. We think some mistake has been made, as we can assure the gallant colonel that not even one-half per cent of single-tube are fitted on machines used in England today.

The same issue of the same journal contained this: It is now conceded by all who pretend to a knowledge of the bicycle, and of tires, that the double-tube tire is the most practical, and at the same time, the fastest form. All the important speed records of the world are now held by the double-tube tires.

It is very difficult to make a tire airtight. Success depends upon the integrity of the inner lining. Tires from which the inner lining cannot be removed, are impossible to make airtight for any length of time.

The chief difficulty with the single-tube tire is that it is really a double-tube tire with the inner tube stuck fast to the outer one, and that "single-tube" method of manufacturing tires (atmospheric pressure inside) makes the rubber of the inner tube porous. Friction on the outside will also make it porous in time. The air escapes through little holes and finds its way out by way of the fabric or some worn spot in the outer tube. When the single-tube is once punctured it seems impossible to repair it so that it will remain airtight. The plugs, whether vulcanized in or not, soon work loose, beside disfiguring the tire and making hard lumps, which on a smooth road can be felt at each revolution of the wheel.
