

GREECE

Europe Does Not Fear War.
Sole Aim of Greeks Is Shown to Be
Annexation of Crete.

LONDON, March 15.—(Copyright, 1897, by Associated Press.)—The Cretan question is still absorbing the attention of Europe, and the newspapers here are full of speculation from all the capitals as to the next move of the powers. All kinds of so-called semi-official statements are afloat, and many of them are undoubtedly launched by the various governments in order to test the drift of popular and ministerial feeling in the matter. An idea, however, is gaining ground that there will be no war, and that Greece must climb down.

An indication of this is shown in the statement of M. Zamil, president of the Greek chamber, telegraphed here, in which he says he is personally disposed to accept the proposal for autonomy for the island of Crete, as a step toward its annexation to Greece. The fact is that in Europe, even among the people who supported the Greeks when they thought their object was the freedom of the Cretans, sympathy is now tiring, and it is seen that the sole aim of the Greeks is annexation.

The news of Commodore Reinock's perfidy in not communicating to the insurgents the remonstrances and demand of the powers, as well as their proposition to grant autonomy to the island, has been a severe blow to the cause of Greece, while a letter from W. J. Stillman formerly United States consul at Canea, to the Times throws further unpleasant light upon the Greek methods. Mr. Stillman says that at the end of the long revolt of 1868-69, the Cretans obtained concessions which afforded most complete satisfaction. Mr. Stillman, as United States consul at Canea, was the intermediary between the insurgents and the grand vizier.

At that moment the Greek government stopped the supply of food and powder, which largely came from the foreign Cretan committees, and sent to Crete a band of volunteers commanded by Chief Petrosoulis, a friend of the then Turkish prime minister. This chief, unopposed by the Turks, took command of all the insurgent forces, and without firing a shot, yielded the island to the Turks, not even stipulating that amnesty should be granted to the chiefs, and the revolt was suppressed in the moment of its triumph by its Athenian friends. Mr. Stillman adds that he can give all the details of this infamous transaction from personal participation.

Bismarck's Opinion.

BERLIN, March 15.—Prince Bismarck, in the Hamburger Nachrichten, comments on German intervention in the Cretan imbroglio. He says that, so far as Germany is concerned, the Cretans may cut each other's throats till none of them are left, and that European peace should not be menaced by this Cretan farce.

Military Train Dynamited.

ATHENS, March 15.—The Ustic's Larissa correspondent says that the news of the destruction of a railroad bridge over the river Vardar, near Salonika, has been confirmed. The bridge was dynamited by a train carrying 3000 Turkish troops passed. Many carriages were thrown from the rails and many soldiers drowned. The transportation of Turkish troops has been suspended until the bridge is restored.

Anxiety in Salonica.

Salonica, March 15.—Great anxiety prevails here, as the inhabitants fear the town will be attacked by the Greeks and war will be declared. Muslim refugees are flocking into Salonica from various parts of Thessaly. Seventy-two battalions of Turkish infantry, six regiments of cavalry and 20 batteries of artillery are already concentrated on the Greek frontier.

Servian Frontier.

ATHENS, March 15.—It is officially stated here that Turkey is sending 30,000 troops to the Servian frontier. A dispatch from Canea filed at 11 p. m. states that pillaging at Retimo and Heraklion continues incessantly.

Extra Watch on Butler.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 15.—The police authorities have placed an extra watch on Murderer Butler to prevent him taking his own life. Butler sent for a newspaper man who had befriended him and appealed for aid in procuring six grains of morphine. Butler is reported to have said: "The jig is up. They have got me, and will take me back to Australia. I know what will be done with me there, and I do not propose to go."

His confidante, instead of aiding him to cheat the gallows, promptly reported Butler's request to the Chief of Police.

Preliminary steps for an appeal in behalf of Ashe or Butler from the decision of Judge Morrow in the habeas corpus case were taken by his attorneys. No appeal can be taken to the supreme court in such cases unless the judge denying the writ certifies that the construction of the constitution or a treaty is involved. The necessary papers setting out the record of the case and the question of jurisdiction raised were presented to Judge Morrow for his certification. If he finds that the necessary questions on which to base an appeal are involved, the papers will be filed and an appeal be taken. In that case Ashe's attorney say they will sue out a writ of error and take the case to the circuit court of appeals.

Alderman Drew, whose testimony was depended on for conviction, refused to stand to connect Haney with the matter at all. He admitted finding in a book an envelope containing \$300 addressed to him. He used the money. He professed ignorance as to who sent it, or why it was sent.
Before the grand jury Drew swore he had been given \$300 by Haney for a vote on paying contracts.
Judge Smith scored Alderman Drew severely. He ordered the alderman held in \$3,000 bonds, to answer to a charge of perjury or larceny before the next grand jury.
