It should be remembered that the present method of carrying hops in cold storage helps to prevent their wakelee's Squirrel and Gopher Exteraging, and in many a brewery today there are '95 goods that are intrinsically worth about as much as the '96 crop. This makes brewers less dependent upon each season's hops. Stock was so cheap last year that unusually heavy supplies were put away in this way. The trading here between dealers is of small consequence.
