The mill at Dexter has been sold and will be moved to Drain.

The grasshoppers at Umpqua, are said to be destroying vegetables.

The Yamhill county, fruit exchange at its meeting held last Monday, at Newberg, decided not to ship any green fruit this year.

In the last two weeks, J. H. Frazer has hauled to and sold in Moro 4000 pounds of hams, cured on his farm in Sherman county.

Ten thousand bushels of wheat stored at Halsey are reported to have been sold to Moore Ferguson & Co., at prices ranging from 72 to 75 cents.

Thursday afternoon the 16-year-old son of Mr. Geo. Crawford cut off his thumb and one finger and badly lacerated several others at the Eugene sawmill.

Mr. A. Coleman, of Hadleyville, was severely injured by an ugly ram, who pounced upon him, butting him to the ground and badly skinning him up.

Greer, Mills & Co., of Chicago, have begun suit in the federal court, against The Dalles National bank, and H. S. Wilson, receiver, to recover \$13,500.

S. W. Sargent, of Yoncalla, father of Mrs. A. J. Petner, hung himself to a rafter in the water closet at Petner's place Friday morning with a line taken from a set of harness. Cause is supposed to be loss of health and eyesight.

Mr. Risch has a prune orchard of six acres planted to beans, and the grass hoppers have eaten the beans up and have stripped half the leaves from the prune trees. They have begun eating the leaves of Mr. G. E. Brewer's orchard also, and if nothing turns up to change the present state of things they will have them stripped of every vestige of foliage in a couple of weeks more.
